- Follow Host Ushers' directions at communion and departure

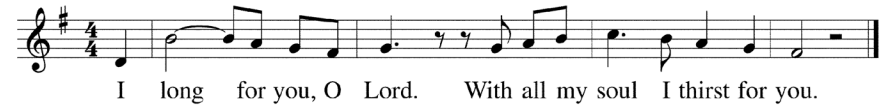

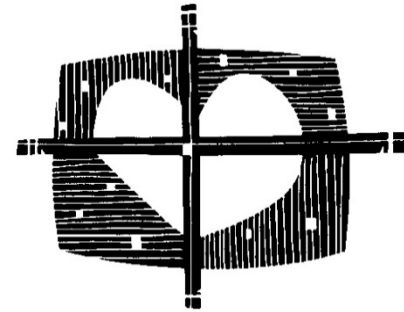
